### The GREAT FLOOD!

I don't want you to get the impression that everything went off without a hitch. During the week leading up to our Christmas service the sewer clogged and overflowed into our church THREE TIMES! With much to be done in preparation for our Russian and Indian services, as well as a fellowship for our language students, we ended cleaning sewage out of the office for two days. I will not force you to look at the photos, but trust me when I say, it was not a pretty sight.

# **Special Prayer Needs**

In December our rent was increased from \$1000 to \$1400 a month. It was shock to us, but the reality is that this is a great deal in the Russian market. Please pray that our support would cover this increased expense each month.

I recently discovered that my gear box and radiator on my van need to be replaced. Parts for my van are expensive and must be ordered from Korea so this will be a very expensive hassle. Pray that we can resolve it quickly and inexpensively.

Russia announced new visa laws that may hinder missionaries like us from staying in the country for more than three months. It is still unclear if these laws will affect western missionaries, but please pray that God would keep the door open to minister here.
