Broken Bones

On July 15th our kids were playing at my Mom's house. **Chase fell** from a slide and hurt her arm. My mom called us and we went to pick her up. She was in obvious pain so we took her to the ER where they confirmed that she had broken her arm. The fracture was on the ulna near the elbow. She was given a temporary cast and referred to a orthopedic doctor.

The following Monday we took her to the bone specialist and he said that it would heal easily with a cast. We had been warning Craton not to break

any bones because our family was taking us to a water park next week, but now we were worried that Chase would not be able to



swim. We were happy to find out that they could give her a waterproof cast that she could swim and bathe in.

The Healing Process

Over the next few weeks Chase began doing more than ever. She improved greatly in her swimming and played as if there was nothing wrong with her arm. After only 3 weeks she had the cast removed and she is as good as new. Thank you all for your prayers. Keep praying for Craton, too. We are still hoping we can get him back to Russia with no broken bones.
