ACTS MINISTRY

So each week we meet, discuss different options and opportunities, decide what we should do. One time, we got up at 5am and went to a fruit market asking for their rotten fruit and vegetables. Then we brought it all to the church in the neighborhood we build our Homes of Hope in. They are starting a neighborhood garden to be able to grow their own produce, but need to make compost to fertilize the soil. So we helped them out that way. Another time, we made and wrapped breakfast plates, printed off the story of the Prodigal Son, and went to different places in the city and handed them out to homeless people. My group went downtown and had some amazing conversations. We met this guy who shines shoes and called over a bunch of the homeless men that he knew. Many of them couldn't read, so we read them the story and talked to them about how it shows God's heart for them. Each time, the shoe shiner listened in and, at the end, he asked if he too could have one of the sheets

with the story on it. He read it for himself and at the end told us that that was his story! He then went on to tell us his testimony of how he left home and crossed into the States illegally, but got sent back after he got into a bad accident, and how his family took him back in and cared for him and showed him who Jesus was. It was so amazing and he was so excited that we were there to show other people the same love that he had been shown. One of the other guys was so touched that he said that he was going to copy the story and hand it out to all of his friends!!!!!



WORK ON THE BASE

Right now on base I am doing a lot of different things. I have been translating some weeks for the DTS and the Basic Leadership School (BLS) - up to 8 hours a day.
