I felt like our focus this year was a little bit different though. In the past, we've really focused on evangelism and seeing as many people saved as possible, and this year we also saw hundreds of people come to know God, but our focus was more on quality than quantity, and was on really bringing the kingdom of God to earth. We saw a lot healings and people encounters with God and experiencing His love for them. With our street evangelism teams, we gave out free hugs and free "spiritual readings" (basically prophesying over them), and different things like that. I kind of wandered between teams this year, as my "job" was organizing all of the worship times. Several nights, I went inside Carnaval with one of my students, and there was one family that we ministered to that really stuck out to me. They were living in a cardboard box on the side of the street, the father was collecting cans to sell for money, and they had 5 young kids. I really spoke to them about hope in Jesus. The father had been in an accident and had a bad limp. We prayed for him a few times and each time he said that it got better and better. Then we saw him like a month later and he said that every day his leg had been getting better and they wanted a Bible. We collected cans for them as we walked the streets and gave them to them at the end of each night. I just felt God's heart of love and compassion for them and felt compelled to do whatever I could to help them out.
